
#### **Field Maintenance**

#### Show and Tell

Bob Juncosa introduced Will Bischoff to the club. Will, now 95 years old, was a past member of CVA and gave a riveting talk about his 44-year career at Grumman on Long Island, NY, that started in 1948. As a structural engineer and eventual executive, he worked on all the major projects for the company during that period, the most interesting and satisfying being the Apollo Lunar Module.

During his time at Grumman, he would pass one of the last F8F Bearcats ever produced. N700A had a special paint scheme and was used for PR and VIP flights. In the 60s the plane went to the Cornell as a research plane before going into private hands. It is now at the Palm Springs Air Museum in California.

Will's fascination with the plane led him to building an R/C model in the early 2000's. The plane flew just a few times before going into storage. Now, at 95, Will decided that it was time to part with his special model. He generously gifted it to Bob Juncosa with the condition that he could see it fly again. Bob went over the plane and found it to be in excellent condition, requiring very little to get it into flying condition.

When the meeting concluded, Bob and Will took the Bearcat out to the flight line for its first of two test flights. The first flight was just few circuits around the field to get used to the plane and then back down again. It wasn't a perfect landing but good enough.

After a few adjustments it was time for another flight. This time with pilot and plane more used to each other, a few rolls, loops, and even a split-S were in the flight plan that culminated in a near perfect landing.



The meeting was adjourned at 1:48pm.


